

BTEC LEVEL 3 ICT

National Extended Certificate

Computers and information technology are becoming increasingly more important to organisations. Courses such as Information Technology are more popular both at A Level and at University. This course is the equivalent to an A Level and offers a learner-centred approach to learning with a combination of project-based assessments and exams. Students who choose to follow this course also develop their practical, interpersonal and thinking skills which are much sought after by employers and higher education.

The Course Involves:

Year One:

- **Unit 1** - Information Technology Systems
- **Unit 6** - Website Development

Year Two:

- **Unit 2** - Creating Systems to Manage Information
- **Unit 3** - Using Social Media in Business

Assessment

- **Unit 1** - Assessed by external examination
- **Unit 6** - Project based assessment marked internally by teachers and externally moderated by BTEC
- **Unit 2** - Project based assessment set and marked by BTEC
- **Unit 3** - Project based assessment marked internally by teachers and externally moderated by BTEC

Particular Subjects, Skills or Interests

As a minimum, you will normally require a grade C/4 in GCSE ICT. You should also have at least a grade C/4 in GCSE Mathematics and a grade C/4 in GCSE English.

Post-18 Opportunities


