Development of our new curriculum:

Teachers and support staff have worked collaboratively and extensively to design our new curriculum, ensuring throughout their work that they hold the four purposes at the heart of developments.

The curriculum is designed so that our pupils progress in both breadth and depth of their skills, knowledge and understanding, and can make links and connections between subjects to accelerate their learning so that they can solve problems and think creatively.

High quality pedagogy underpins the 'big idea' themes we have developed in each area of learning and experience and these 'big ideas' will be revisited throughout Year 7 to 9 to reinforce the learning and build upon knowledge and experiences to ensure progression.

Regular assessment will provide explicit feedback to pupils so they can take direct action to improve and have a thorough understanding of their own skills and knowledge.

Stakeholder involvement:

The Governing Body has been strategically planning changes to the curriculum over the last two years to ensure that we are able to provide appropriate time for each Area of Learning and Experience in pupil timetables. This has ensured a broad and balanced curriculum is provided which meets the needs of all learners.

Pupils have been consulted through questionnaires, group discussions and the Curriculum, Learning & Lessons Student Committee about changes to the time allocation for different subjects, the development of the new curriculum and The Maelor School Vision and Aspirations for our learners. They have also given us feedback about how they are assessed and what type of information helps them to make better progress.

Parent consultation through online surveys and feedback forms has provided overwhelming positive support and agreement with our vision and aspirations for learners through the new curriculum.

Review:

During the summer term 2022, we are trialling aspects of the new curriculum with Year 7 classes in order to further inform our planning. This will be reviewed ready for a further pilot year during 2022-23. Monitoring and evaluation will take place throughout the academic year to ensure ongoing reflection and refinement ready for full implementation in September 2023.
